

In the latest printing of the *Traditional Logic I Student Workbook* and *Teacher Key*, we have replaced some of the sentences and syllogisms in the exercises with new ones in order to remove any pop culture references. However, in each case, the new sentences/syllogisms are of the same kind as the previous ones. Thus, depending on the type of exercise, the answers will be either identical to what they were previously or at least formatted and structured in the same way. Some examples are as follows:

[Page 23, Exercise 18](#)

- Sentence c. has been changed from "Where in the world is Carmen San Diego?" to "Where is Robin Hood hiding?" Answer is the same.
- Sentence f. has been changed from "Barney (the purple dinosaur) is a man." to "Humpty Dumpty is a man." Answer is the same.
- Sentence j. has been changed from "No purple dinosaurs go to heaven." to "No unicorns go to heaven." Answer is the same.
- Sentence l. has been changed from "Barney is President of the United States." to "Winnie-the-Pooh is President of the United States." Answer is the same.

- Statement d. has been changed from "Michael Jordan is a good basketball player." to "George Washington was a great president." Answer has been changed to "All people who are not good presidents are not George Washington."

[Page 64, Exercise 21](#)

- Syllogism c. has been changed from "All good basketball players can shoot well. Michael Jordan is a good basketball player. Therefore, Michael Jordan can shoot well." to "All good philosophers can reason well. Aristotle was a good philosopher. Therefore, Aristotle can reason well." The Major term is now "good people who can reason well"; the Minor term is now "Aristotle"; and the Middle term is now "good philosopher."
