This means that the interior of the most recent version might look a little different, but the content hasn't changed.

General notes and updates can be found at the top.

The bookstore errata sheet doesn't just contain corrections! It's also where you'll find helpful updates to the newest versions of the product.

To find your product's REV date (the date when your version was revised), look next to the barcode on the back cover.

Some bookstore errata sheets, like this one, contain multiple sections. These are arranged so that errata entries for the most recent version are at the top of the page, while errata entries for older versions are at the bottom. Sections for older versions contain more errata entries than sections for newer ones because many of these errata were discovered and corrected in more recent versions.

The "Correction" column contains instructions so that you can correct an error in your product.

To find the errata for your copy of a product, all you need to do is find the section that corresponds with your product's REV date. These are the only errata entries that apply to your version.

If your product doesn't have a REV date next to the barcode, then check the publication date on the copyright page. You may own the original version of the product.
